RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE CITY OF BATESVILLE, MISSISSIPPI, PURSUANT TO SECTION 57-7-1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AS AMENDED AND SUPPLEMENTED FROM TIME TO TIME, DETERMINING THAT THE REAL PROPERTY HEREINAFTER DESCRIBED IS SURPLUS PROPERTY AND IS NOT NEEDED FOR AIRPORT OR GOVERNMENTAL PURPOSES AND DIRECTING THAT AN EXCLUSIVE PERPETUAL EASEMENT ON, OVER, AND ACROSS SAID PROPERTY BE CONVEYED TO YANCEY BROS. CO. ON THE CONDITIONS, AND FOR THE CONSIDERATION SET FORTH HEREIN, AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the City of Batesville, Mississippi [the “Governing Authority” and the “City”], acting for and on behalf of the City does hereby find, determine, adjudicate, and declare as follows:

1.

By deed dated August 27, 1986, and recorded in the Batesville office of the Chancery Clerk of Panola County Mississippi in Deed Book M-6 at page 419 [the Deed”] the Industrial Development Authority of the Second Judicial District of Panola County , Mississippi , [“IDA”] conveyed to the City the following identified real property [hereinafter the “Property”] lying and being situated in the City of Batesville, Mississippi, on, over, and across which lies a railroad track spur and other related improvements [together the “Spur Track”] to-wit:

See Exhibit “A” attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.

Yancey Bros. Co. [“Yancey”] has requested that the City convey to Yancey an exclusive perpetual easement on, over, and across the Property [the “Easement”] on, over, and across which Easement is located the Spur Track

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2.

The Deed contains certain conditions [provisions relating to Protective Covenants, exclusivity, and reversion] [“Conditions”]. The Governing Authority has no actual knowledge of the IDA invoking any of the Conditions. Thus, the Governing Authority believes that the action authorized in this Resolution is appropriate.

3.

Section 57-7-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended and supplemented from time to time, authorizes a municipality to convey its interest in real property for industrial and commercial purposes upon such terms and conditions as the municipality shall prescribe when such property is surplus property and is not needed for airport purposes or for other governmental purposes.

4.

The Easement runs through the real property that Yancey intends to purchase pursuant to a purchase contract with Crown, Cork, & Seal (USA) Inc. The City’s conveyance of the Easement to Yancey will enhance Yancey’s ability to operate and advance Yancey’s manufacturing business on the real property.

5.

Yancey has represented to the City that it anticipates employing at least 250 people at this site and will have an estimated annual payroll at or above the average compensation for this area (as required by the economic incentives Yancey is receiving). Yancey has represented to the City that it intends to be a good corporate citizen and support local causes, particularly ones that are of interest to its employees. Yancey has represented that it will manufacture fuel tanks and

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enclosures for generators that will support primarily data centers but also hospitals, water treatment plants, and other critical infrastructure.

6.

The Governing Authority finds and determines that the conveyance of the Easement to Yancey and Yancey's use of the Easement will result in benefits to the City and its citizens including but not limited to economic development, jobs, and wages and this conveyance is in the best interest of the City and its citizens and will promote the economic and commercial development of the City and the community.

7.

The Governing Authority finds and determines that the aforesaid benefits to the City are good, adequate, reasonable, sufficient, and fair consideration for the City's conveyance of the Easement to Yancey.

8.

The conveyance is contingent upon and subject to Yancey's purchasing the real property it has under contract as stated above and is also contingent upon any changes in Mississippi law that would prohibit the conveyance of the easement to Yancey as contemplated by this Resolution before the conveyance is consummated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Governing Authority acting for and on behalf of the City as follows:

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I.

That the matters set forth in the above and foregoing paragraphs are hereby found, declared, and adjudicated to be true and correct and are incorporated into this paragraph by reference.

II.

That the Governing Authority does hereby find, adjudicate, and determine that the Easement is surplus real property and is not used for airport purposes or other governmental purposes, and that it is in the best interest of the City and will promote the economic and commercial development of the City for the City to convey the Easement to Yancey as authorized herein.

III.

That upon Yancey purchasing the real property that it has under contract and providing evidence thereof to the City, the City shall convey the Easement to Yancey pursuant to, and on the terms and conditions and for the consideration contained in this Resolution; the Mayor and Clerk of the City are hereby authorized and directed, for and on behalf of and in the name of the City, to execute, acknowledge, and deliver an instrument conveying the Easement to Yancey subject to the Conditions and in its as and where is condition without warranty of any kind as to the condition of the Easement and all other documents reasonably necessary for or incidental to the conveyance pursuant to this Resolution and the form of such instrument and other documents shall be in such form as is satisfactory to the Mayor and City Clerk, in their discretion with advice of the City's Legal Department, as being in the best interest of the City, and such approval shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery thereof.

V.

That the Mayor and Clerk of the City be and each of them acting alone is hereby authorized and directed to take such actions and to execute such documents as may be necessary to effectuate the purposes of this Resolution.
